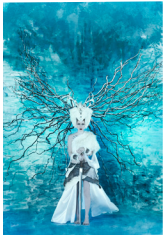
3 6:30 PM | Urban Lumber Co Furniture Showroom (28 E Broadway)

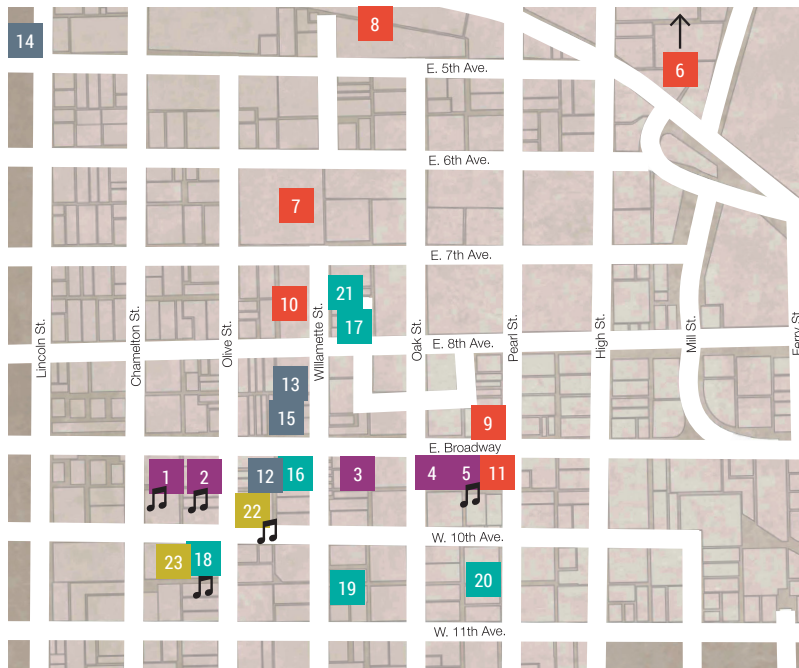

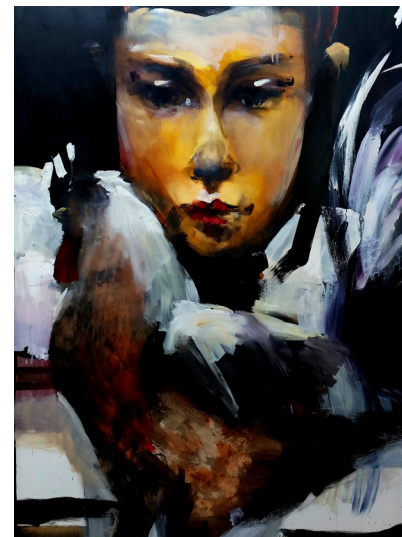
