The SLUG Queens are sliming their way onto the art scene with their first art exhibition SLUG Queen Art-stravaganza, featuring creations from a dozen Queens in a variety of mediums including paintings, prints, quilts, textile art, and sculpture.

14 Epic Seconds (30 E 11th Ave)

The One Wall Gallery presents the twoperson, two-location exhibit Parallel Lands, featuring John Richardson and Benjamin Terrell. At first glance there may only be subtle similarities between the artists; one portrays nonobjective space with pencil only, and the other uses landscape to imply grand spaces with oil paint and stain. But both artists share a curiosity for how space and shape relate and what cannot be fully articulated.
