GALLERIES & STUDIOS

2 **Art with Alejandro (5th Street Public Market, 246 E 5th Ave #224)**
This vibrant art gallery and studio showcases diverse works by Alejandro Sarmiento. Also: Paisley Mae explores many mediums and styles, and loves painting figures and turning them into many eyed aliens and magical creatures.

3 **ArtCity Studios on Broadway (160 E Broadway, basement)**
The Soul Success Medals for Humanity by Arianne (Air) Taylor. Here word and art communicate a unique celebration for the invisible strength that resides within the heart of humanity. Bring your phones and headphones. Also: Fourth graders Joy "Birdie" and Mila "Beanie" showcase their watercolors and present a pop-up art making station during the ArtWalk!

4 **Beaudet Gallery at 5th St. Makers Row (590 Pearl St, Suite 106)**
August-born jeweler Hannah Becker shares her birthstone the Peridot and her favorite jewelry pieces using the stone. In addition to jewelry, Hannah is a potter and teaches relief printmaking and watercolor classes at The Craft Center.

5 **FUSE Jewelry Collective (112 E 13th Ave)**
Check out the FUSE showroom, displaying collections by local jewelry designers as well as thoughtfully curated, small-batch gift items. Don't miss newly added work from jewelry artist Brianna Caridio, live music by cellist Ben Hamilton, studio tours of the FUSE Classroom, and a raffle for a free metalsmithing class!

6 **Karin Clarke at the Gordon (590 Pearl St, Suite 105)**
A changing inventory of paintings, prints, photography, cards, and mixed-media works by NW artists such as Robert Schlegel, Heather Jacks, Rick Bartow, and Bets Cole.

7 **Karin Clarke Gallery (760 Willamette St)**
Mark Clarke: Northwest Master, a varied exhibit of landscapes, figures, and abstract paintings from the estate of one of the gallery's most popular artists. Curated by the artist's daughter, Gallerist Karin Clarke, the show features nearly 30 works, mostly painted in acrylic. Art connoisseur Roger Saydack speaks about Mark Clarke's work at 6pm.

8 **The New Zone Gallery (110 E 11th Ave)**
An eclectic mix of art created by New Zone members; *Undressed*, figure art by Will Mitchell; *to be continued...*, a retrospective show of Steve LaRiccia's photographic work and interactive assemblages from the past 45+ years; *Trust Your Empire*, an exhibition looking back at the spoils of the Happyface Empire under the leadership of Erik Roggeveen; live music with Sam Fields on piano. **6:30pm: Artist remarks with Will Mitchell.**

9 **Windowfront Exhibitions (99 W 10th Ave, south windows)**
Diversity Project, a photography installation created by Kenji Shimizu, aims to encourage and celebrate diversity from an immigrant's point of view.

10 **J. Scott Cellars on 5th Tasting Room (207 E 5th Ave, #105)**
Jennifer Billman/Mann paints impressionist landscapes while Carolyn Quinn exhibits *The Practice of Discovery*, a series of abstracts.

11 **One Vision Nutrition (946 Willamette St)**
Aliens Are Real, and Colors Heal, artwork by DeLenn Rufo.

12 **Starlight Lounge (830 Olive St)**
Digital art by John Huston, drawn by hand in the Adobe sketch app, along with Tombow markers on paper. This body of work includes portraits, some with space backgrounds, and a few explorations of horror drawings on napkins. 21+ only

SHOP & EXPLORE

13 **Area 51 Piercing (505 Willamette Street, Suite 100)**
Oregon's premier piercing studio features the body piercing jewelry and rings of Jared Duke. Jared has sold his work all over Oregon and Washington, including at Oregon Country Fair and Art in the Vineyard.

14 **Broadway Commerce Center (44 W Broadway)**
Be prepared to be mesmerized by the ultimate mash up of science and art! Amethyst "Ame" Beard shows LED-light responsive art, which changes dramatically as the lights change, creating optical illusions and a 3D effect. Art glasses provided.

15 **Epic Seconds (30 E 11th Ave)**
Getting Along is a series of oil on canvas paintings by DiDi Davidovich about how we fit into our environments—the push and the pull—while trying to live harmoniously within our own boundaries.

16 **Eugene Public Library (100 W 10th Ave, Newspapers and Magazines Room, 2nd floor)**
Momentary Emotions, paintings by Uyen-thi Nguyen. Music 6-7pm: A concert titled "The Happiest Day of My Life" by witty singer-songwriter and ukulele player Jay Seeley.

17 **Flux Crystals (280 W Broadway)**
Megan Burnside, an artist from Veneta, makes and paints ceremonial drums, and also explores digital, generative, and mixed media art.

18 **Oregon Art Supply (1020 Pearl St)**
Members of Whiteaker Printmakers, a nonprofit fine art studio and gallery, present their traditional hand-pulled prints. Showcased printmaking methods range from Linocut and Screen Print to Etching and Mezzotint. Open until 7:30pm. **6pm: Artist remarks and demos.**
