GALLERIES & STUDIOS

3 **Art with Alejandro (5th Street Public Market, 246 E 5th Ave #224)**
Step into Alejandro Sarmiento's vibrant world of diverse paintings to captivate your senses, often created as you watch. Venture further and find yourself enchanted by Paisley Mae, who breathes life into figures, morphing them into spellbinding aliens and mystical creatures.

4 **ArtCity Studios on Broadway (160 E Broadway, basement)**
From 6:30-8pm, Eugene Printmakers will be printing from blocks inspired by Latin American culture, carved by their members, with a variety of presses.

5 **Beaudet Gallery at 5th St. Makers Row (590 Pearl St, Suite 106)**
At 6pm, Charles Beaudet discusses the process of design, from customer consultation to fabrication to long term care and repair of your jewelry. This is a great talk for people interested in getting something custom made or for new jewelers with questions about the industry!

6 **FUSE Jewelry Collective (112 E 13th Ave)**
Check out the FUSE showroom, displaying collections by local jewelry designers as well as curated, small-batch items. Don't miss live music by cellist Ben Hamilton, metalsmithing demos by Una Barrett, and studio tours. Enter their raffle drawing for a free metalsmithing class!

7 **Karin Clarke at the Gordon (590 Pearl St, Suite 105)**
A changing inventory of paintings, prints, photographs, cards, and mixed-media works by NW artists such as Robert Schlegel, Heather Jacks, Rick Bartow, and Bets Cole.

8 **Karin Clarke Gallery (760 Willamette St)**
A group show featuring the winners of last year's Eugene Biennial, including sculpture, paintings, mixed media, and printmaking works by Ron Conrad, Doug Davidovich, Kitty Kingston, Tom Miller, Danuta Muszynska, Marjorie Taylor, Jud Turner, Libby Wadsworth, and Michael Whitenack.

9 **OSLP Arts & Culture Center (110 E 11th Ave, Suite C)**
A showcase of artwork in many sizes and mediums created by participants in the OLSLP Arts & Culture program.

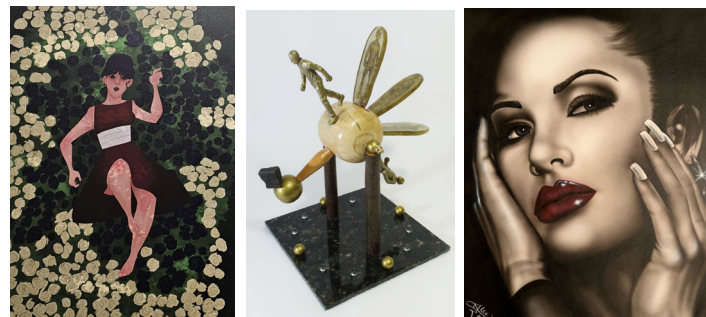
10 **The New Zone Gallery (110 E 11th Ave)**
"Zone 4 All," the bi-annual non-juried open show that brings together hundreds of artists from our region, displaying their creativity in a variety of styles, techniques, and mediums.

11 **Windowfront Exhibitions (99 W 10th Ave, south windows)**
Diversity Project, a photography installation created by Kenji Shimizu, aims to encourage and celebrate diversity from an immigrant's point of view.

12 **J. Scott Cellars on 5th Tasting Room (207 E 5th Ave, #105)**
Jenifer Billman/Mann paints impressionist landscapes while Carolyn Quinn exhibits *The Practice of Discovery*, a series of abstracts.

13 **Starlight Lounge (830 Olive St)**
Digital art by Nyx Veliz. Nyx brings their work to life through emulating physical mediums digitally. Their work is inspired by their upbringing as a third culture kid and as a member of the LGBTQ community.

SHOP & EXPLORE

14 **Allies, LLC (200 E 11th Ave, Suite 130)**
The Grand Opening! Stop by to celebrate their new location and view a collaborative exhibit showcasing work by clients of Allies.

15 **Area 51 Piercing (505 Willamette Street, Suite 100)**
Oregon's premier piercing studio features the body piercing jewelry and rings of Jared Duke. Jared has sold his work all over Oregon and Washington, including at Oregon Country Fair and Art in the Vineyard.

16 **Books With Pictures Eugene (99 W Broadway C)**
Green Sword Art, drawings, papercuts, and pixel art from Books With Pictures manager Finlay Louden.

17 **Broadway Commerce Center (44 W Broadway)**
RealEyes Ink, stylistic airbrush portraits and scenes on paper, canvas, and fabric by Alexis Tadeo.

18 **Bumble Boutique (233 W 5th Ave)**
This new ArtWalk venue focuses on vintage clothing, handmade jewelry, and local artwork. Featured artist Hannah Austin is a fabric collage embroidery artist specializing in landscapes. Inspired after a cross-country move in 2018, most of her artwork is influenced heavily by the great vistas of Oregon and the Pacific Northwest. She strives to utilize inherited and secondhand fabric scraps in her pieces to minimize textile waste.

19 **Epic Seconds (30 E 11th Ave)**
Wearables by Helen Liu, clothing made with wool sourced from friends, salvaged spalted wood, homegrown indigo dye, hand-spun yarn, and waste from Starbucks plastic bags. Also on display: *Getting Along* is a series of oil on canvas paintings by DiDi Davidovich about how we fit into our environments while trying to live harmoniously within our own boundaries

20 **Eugene Public Library (100 W 10th Ave, Newspapers and Magazines Room, 2nd floor)**
Momentary Emotions, paintings by Uyen-thi Nguyen. Music 6-7pm: SamaZama Duo creates a mix of traditional and contemporary Japanese music with tango, jazz, blues, and western classical music.

21 **Flux Crystals (280 W Broadway)**
Portals and the Oracle, work by Gloria Udosenata that explores the relationship between the natural world and the Divine. Live music: Experimental ambient music by Vele.
