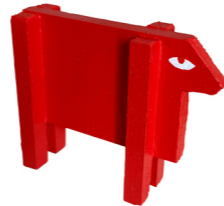

2 Art with Alejandro (5th Street Public Market, 246 E 5th Ave #224)
Explore this dynamic art space, which is a rich tapestry of styles and subjects. Check out Alejandro Sarmiento's striking new tiger additions. Be mesmerized by Paisley Mae's artistic alchemy, turning simple figures into magical entities. Heather Sterling-Minder's art reveals the human spirit through dreamlike and symbolic imagery.

3 ArtCity Studios on Broadway (160 E Broadway, basement)
WheelHaus Arts presents an immersive, eclectic Halloween/Oddball art show created by over 4 dozen students and David Placencia. From 5-8 pm, Foxlight Labs hosts a Cloud Sale! Come by to see the newest collection of hanging

sculptures, and learn how they are made. Eugene Printmakers will be printing fall/Halloween themed images from 6:30-8pm. Let's get inky!

4 Beudet Gallery at 5th St. Makers Row (590 Pearl St, Suite 106)

6 Framin' Artworks (505 High St)
A collaborative exhibit by two friends, featuring Day of the Dead themed pieces by Cheryl Wilson and whimsical art by WaWee.

7 FUSE Jewelry Collective (112 E 13th Ave)
Check out the FUSE showroom, with collections by local designers and small-batch items. Don't miss live music by cellist Ben Hamilton, metalsmithing demos by Una Barrett, studio tours, and a raffle!

8 Karin Clarke Gallery (760 Willamette St)
A show featuring winners from last year's Eugene Biennial: Ron Conrad, Doug Davidovich, Kitty Kingston, Tom Miller, Danuta Muszynska, Marjorie Taylor, Jud Turner, Libby Wadsworth, and Michael Whitenack.

9 OSLP Arts & Culture Center (110 E 11th Ave, Suite C)
Super Natural, 2D and 3D works representing the natural world, plus ethereal and otherworldly elements.

10 The New Zone Gallery (110 E 11th Ave)
A mix of art created by New Zone members; *Smirking at the Laws of Physics*, 3D art by Robert Bolman; *Near and Far en Plein Air*, plein air works by Patti McNutt; *Salon des Refusés*, works not selected for the Mayor's Art Show; live music by David Dougherty on acoustic guitar.

11 Windowfront Exhibitions
824 Charnelton - *When It Rains*, oil on canvas paintings by Yuruhary Gallardo-Garcia that depict nature as if it was perceived by a child playing outside in the rain.

12 260 W Broadway - The Veil, an installation of chicken wire sculptures by Kimberly Strohman that bring attention to lives impacted by pregnancy and infant loss.

Self-taught artist Shimea Jordan experiments with pouring acrylic paint and using resin. Through the

chaos of the pandemic she started to create pieces that made her feel loved and seen as a black woman.

18 Starlight Lounge (830 Olive St)
House Bozell Creep-o-Rama!, Bonnie Bozell's 5th Halloween Showcase includes a batch of signature creepy pieces and vintage inspired scenes. Stop by her pop-up to purchase coloring books or her pumpkin carving design book! 21+

SHOP & EXPLORE

19 Allies LLC (200 E 11th Ave, Suite 130)
Support the efforts of our neurodiverse community! Allies shows an array of artwork by their talented artists in many mediums, with featured artist Beth Fry.

20 Area 51 Piercing (505 Willamette Street, Suite 100)
Oregon's premier piercing studio features the body piercing jewelry and rings of Jared Duke, who has sold his work all over Oregon and Washington, including at Oregon Country Fair and Art in the Vineyard.

21 Books With Pictures Eugene (99 W Broadway C)
SCIENCE AND COMICS, featuring collaborations of UO's Science & Comics Initiative, a program that brings students together with faculty and researchers to produce comics highlighting STEM subjects.

22 Bumble Boutique (233 W 5th Ave)
Johanna Stiffler's photography entices viewers to explore the rich Pacific Northwest wilderness and diverse ecosystems through her work.

23 Epic Seconds (30 E 11th Ave)
The One Wall Gallery presents *An Abstraction of Ancestors*, new work from Man In The Woods, alongside two other artists (who paint abstractly) about a sense of place or experience. Man In The Woods is a visual artist from the south of England.

24 Eugene Public Library (100 W 10th Ave, Newspapers and Magazines Room, 2nd floor)
2023 Mayor's Art Show Reception 6-8pm: 2D, 3D and digital work by local artists, plus live painting by Kendra Carnes. Music 6-7pm: A concert by Katie Sontag and Jon Brex on bass. Outside 6-7:30pm: Nicole Medema delivers *Messages From the Universe* as her mail-delivery character, The Mercury Post.

25 Flux Crystals (280 W Broadway)
Bekah Zeimetz paints realistic wildlife and landscapes in acrylic to remind you that magic still exists. Watch her paint live during ArtWalk!

26 MECCA (555 High St)
MECCA challenged artists to make inspiring and creative works of art out of a mystery box of materials. The resulting pieces inspire us to think differently about "waste."

27 Oregon Art Supply (1020 Pearl St)
Janet Brockway displays mixed media prints. Her work is often as simple as applying material, color, shape, form, and texture and then responding to it. Open until 7:30pm.

28 Robert Cecil Salon (545 Willamette)
This new ArtWalk venue features *Balance*, a solo show featuring abstract oil and cold wax paintings by artist Jan Lintz.
