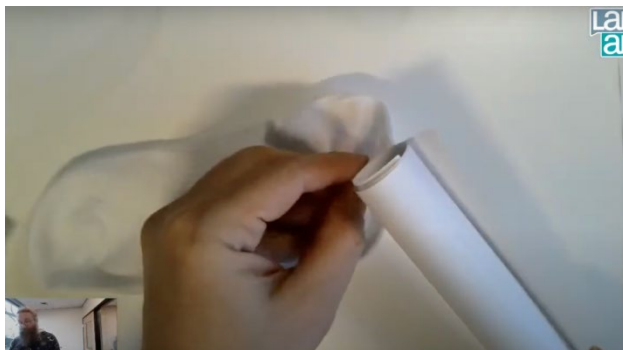

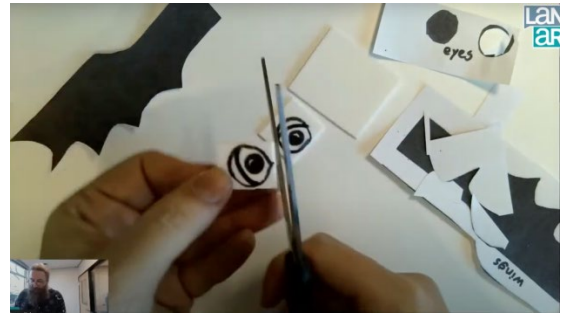
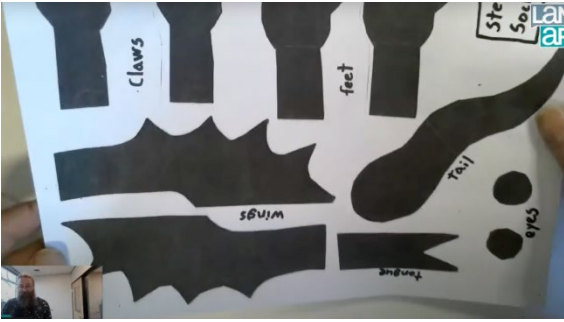
INSTRUCTIONS: If you are not able to access the online video, you can follow these step-by-step directions.

Materials: sock, paper, glue, foam (all included)

Optional materials: markers, hot glue gun (with adult assistance)



- Roll your materials checklist into a tube.
- Place paper tube into sock.
- Flatten paper tube to fill sock.
- Use markers to color your sock!



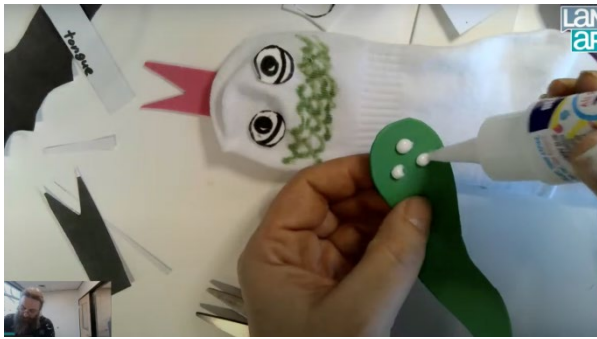
- Cut out the black shapes on your stencil sheet.
- Use round stencil to trace circles on white foam square.
- Cut out eyes from white foam square.
- Use markers to color circles to make the Dragon's eyes.



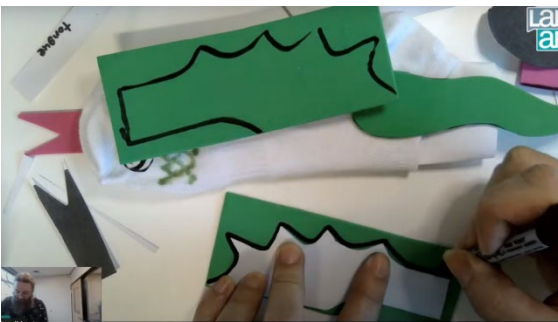
- It is time to start gluing! Ask an adult to help open the sealed cap of the glue bottle. It may need to be cut with scissors.
- When gluing, small spots are best (the size of a lady bug.) Too much glue can make a mess and glue your puppet shut! Clean up glue spills quickly!
- Use small spots of glue to attach eyes near the toe of the sock.



- Use stencil to trace dragon tongue on pink foam sheet.
- Use a small spot of glue to attach tongue to the bottom of the sock near the toe.



- Use stencil to trace out Dragon tail on a foam sheet.
- Cut out tail from foam sheet.
- Use small spots of glue to attach dragon tail near the heel of the sock.



- Use stencil to trace out Dragon wings on foam sheets.
- Cut out wings from foam sheet.
- Use small spots of glue to attach left and right wings near the middle of the sock.



- Use stencil to trace out claws and feet on foam sheets.
- Cut claws and feet from foam sheet.
- Use small spots of glue to attach claws between wings and eyes.
- Use small spots of glue to attach feet between wings and tail.



- This is the hardest step. Now you must wait. Craft glue can take several hours to dry, depending on conditions and quantity of glue used. Allow the puppet to rest overnight to be sure its glue is dry.
- Remove paper materials checklist from inside puppet. It may be glued in. tear paper to remove if necessary.
- Put hand in puppet.
- PLAY!
- Give your puppet a name.
- Congratulations! You made a new friend! Your very own Sock Dragon!
